

RELIGION II CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

1. All assignments and projects are to be identified by PERIOD, CHAPTER/UNIT, PAGE NUMBER, DATE, and your FULL NAME.
2. Answers are to be complete sentences and should indicate the nature of the question. Work at this level of high school should be professional in appearance. All class work must be legible, neat and completed in **ink** on lined paper with a clean edge.

You may also email your written assignments to me on-line via Edline or through my other class website – www.mrfrere.com (this site basically repeats everything on Edline and is meant as a secondary site if you can't access Edline. Details will be explained in class. Please remember to include your name, class period, and name of assignment. Assignments submitted after due date will be counted as late and lose points

3. You are responsible for:

accurate notes - board and discussion notes on all AV material	assignments completed on time being on-time for class
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4. You are expected to participate in daily class discussion honestly, respectfully, and willingly; likewise you are expected to listen and respect what is said by others. Class participation requires raising of hands and being recognized **before** talking.
5. You will need your textbook (**World Religions Third Edition 2009**) and a notebook with you every day.
6. Written assignments and projects should be turned in on time. Assignments not turned in on time will earn appropriate and significant loss of points.
7. Any form of plagiarism or copying will earn a grade of zero. Cheating during a test or exam can earn a grade of zero. Semester exams and final projects will make up approximately 20% of your final grade. Twenty (20) hours of community service must be completed and all forms turned in by April 20, 2011. You must have my prior approval before any outside service is begun.

For any assignments requiring a bibliography or sources, Wikipedia, Google and any other search engine are **never** acceptable as a source. Any bibliography or source information must always be typed.
